We care about your privacy, and we want you to make the most of the ebankIT Summit. Therefore, this privacy notice provides you with information about how ebankIT processes your personal data under this event.

Scope

This privacy notice applies to all individuals registered for or participating in our Summit. It explains how ebankIT processes personal data and for what purposes.

In addition to our own activities, and within the context of the event, your data may also be processed for independent purposes by our partners. These partner-specific purposes are not covered by this notice.

How do we process your personal data ...

... to attend the ebankIT Summit 2025

We will process, under Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR, your name, email address, organization, job title and dietary requirements (if applicable) in order to: (i) reserve your place and welcome you at the Summit; (ii) to manage your accommodation during the event; (iii) provide you with relevant event information, including updates, changes, cancellations, or logistical details; and (iv) manage overall event administration, such as contacting you regarding your participation, and delivering customer support.

This information may be shared with our logistic partners (like catering service, hotel or event apps) to enhance your event experience. A delegate list (including your name and company) may be shared with exhibitors or sponsors of the event. If you sign up for a specific exhibit or sponsor session, your contact details may be shared with the relevant partner.

Your data will be retained for 2 years, after that only statistical data will be kept. Any personal data not relevant to the processing will be deleted two months after.

As data subject, you may request access, rectification, erasure, or restriction of the processing of your personal data.



... to be a part of ebankIT's Summit moments

ebankIT may stream, photograph, and film the Summit, under Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR, for the purpose of marketing our services and promoting future events. As such, we may process your image and, in some cases, your voice. We aim to use wide-angle and rear-facing shots. However, if we wish to capture a specific moment where you are clearly identifiable, we will request your consent in advance.

If you do not wish to be photographed or filmed, please contact us. Your lack – or withdrawal – of consent will not affect your participation. Where possible, we will provide designated photo- and film-free zones.

These recordings may be published on digital platforms such as LinkedIn, Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, and others.

After 10 years, selected materials will be retained for historical purposes, while all other data will be securely deleted. Any personal data that is not relevant will be immediately erased.

You may request access, rectification, erasure, withdrawal of consent, or restriction of processing at any time.

.... to keep in touch with you

We may keep your contact details to contact you after the event to request feedback or a review, under Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR. We may also communicate with you about future events, news, and services we offer, in accordance with your preferences.

Your information will be retained for as long as you are still interested in receiving communications from us.

You may request access, rectification, erasure, objection, or restriction of processing of your personal data at any time.
